Please join us Wednesday, March 16th at 5:30 p.m. at the Atlantis for a dinner celebrating Women's History Month. NNWLA will host a diverse panel of prominent Northern Nevada women judges and attorneys.

Panelists will include Justice Nancy Saitta of the Nevada Supreme Court; Sallie Armstrong, a partner at Downey Brand who represents clients in all areas of bankruptcy and financial restructuring; Kathy Breckenridge, a solo practitioner specializing in domestic relations and family law; Nicole Hicks, a deputy district attorney who led the development of the Child Advocacy Center; Ann Morgan, a director at Fennemore Craig who handles employment law and human resource issues, estate and trust litigation, and general business matters; and Maizie Pusich, an attorney with the Washoe County Public Defender's Office.

Working to Form a More Perfect Union: Honoring Women in Public Service and Government



The National Women's History Month theme for 2016 honors women who have shaped America's history and its future through their public service and government leadership. Although often overlooked and undervalued, these women have dramati-

cally influenced our public policy and the building of viable institutions and organizations. From championing basic human rights to ensuring access and equal opportunity for all Americans, they have led the way in establishing a stronger and more democratic country.

Each year, the National Women's History Project honors several remarkable women and recognizes their important contributions. This year, three of these honorees are attorneys:

Sonia Pressman Fuentes (1928– Present)

Ms. Fuentes was the first woman attorney to work in the General Counsel's Office of the EEOC. She is also a founding member of the National Organization for Women and the advocacy group Federally Employed Women.

Karen Narasaki (1958-Present)

Ms. Narasaki is a lawyer and lobbyist dedicated to issues of Asian American equality. Her work has focused on voting rights, affirmative action, family immigration, and hate crime prevention. She currently serves on the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights.

Inez Milholland (1886-1916)

Ms. Milholland was a leader in the women's suffrage movement as well as an attorney who also fought for the rights of working class women, spoke out for racial equality, and worked for prison reform.
